Task 2:

Task 3:

Which topic features currently in the discussions in your country? Which people do the media write about? Why?

Task 4:

Go to the google news page for your country (e.g. for the [United Kingdom](#) or [Ireland](#)) and look at the headlines/titles for the news from your country. Tell your partner which media they are from and select two that you are interested in. Tell your partner: What do you think are these articles about? Why did you select them?

Task 5:

Now compare the headlines from both countries. Which topics are the same and which are different? What do you think could be the reason for this?
